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- 1 CHMN STAFFORD: All right, let's go on the
- 2 record.
- Now is the time set for the prefiling
- 4 conference for Winchester Transmission project. Let's
- 5 take appearances, please.
- 6 MR. ACKEN: Good morning, Mr. Chairman.
- 7 Bert Acken of Acken Law on behalf of the applicant
- 8 Winchester Transmission, LLC. You see a full cast here.
- 9 You know, if you'd like them to introduce themselves for
- 10 the record and who they are we can do that.
- 11 And maybe -- maybe I'll start off with the
- 12 Torch team, which is the parent of the applicant. And,
- 13 Ms. Born, if you could introduce yourself.
- 14 MS. BORN: Yeah. Hi, Mr. Chairman. I'm
- 15 Sara Born. I'm the director of development of Torch Clean
- 16 Energy. Been working on this project for quite some time.
- 17 I will unfortunately not be part of the hearing, but have
- 18 worked super closely with Bert and the rest of the team
- 19 who will be participating in the hearing as we move
- 20 forward. It's a pleasure to meet you.
- 21 CHMN STAFFORD: Thank you.
- MR. ACKEN: And Rachael?
- MS. TAYLOR: Hi, you all. Yeah, my name's
- 24 Rachael and I am kind of trying to lead the process on the
- 25 Torch side of assisting Dean developing the application.

- 1 And I will be at the hearing but I will not be giving
- 2 testimony; our colleague Scott Leach will be.
- 3 MR. ACKEN: And Adam Davis is also from
- 4 Torch.
- 5 MR. DAVIS: Hey, everybody. Thanks for --
- 6 Yeah, Adam here with Torch as well. More on the technical
- 7 side with Torch just assisting in all ways technical that
- 8 I can. I should be at the hearing as well but, like
- 9 Rachael, probably not testifying.
- 10 MR. ACKEN: And then the additional Torch
- 11 representative who will be joining us is Scott Leach, who
- 12 I believe will be testifying. So -- But he will be
- 13 joining us in a sec.
- 14 And then we have two individuals from SWCA
- 15 who have been developing the application, the resource
- 16 studies for that, and assisting the Torch team with the
- 17 public outreach. So Dean Hazle?
- 18 MR. HAZLE: Hi. Dean Hazle. I plan to
- 19 attend and testify at the hearing on behalf of the
- 20 applicant.
- MR. ACKEN: And Tom, I'm not going to try
- 22 and butcher your last name.
- MR. KORONKIEWICZ: That's okay.
- Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Bert and all.
- 25 I'm Tom Koronkiewicz, SWCA, environmental consultants.

- 1 Environmental specialist and project manager working on
- 2 behalf of Torch Clean Energy.
- MR. ACKEN: And joining us now is Scott 3
- Leach. And Scott, if you could just give a brief 4
- introduction. 5
- MS. BORN: Scott, we can't hear you. 6
- MR. ACKEN: Well, we'll let him -- Maybe 7
- 8 he's having some issues that could be taking a second.
- 9 But once he's -- once he's all logged in and ready to go
- I'll have him --10
- 11 MS. BORN: He's coming in here.
- 12 MR. LEACH: I'm going to do this the
- old-fashioned way. Good afternoon, everyone. I'm Scott 13
- Leach. I'm the chief commercial officer here at Torch. 14
- 15 And I will try to get my computer going, but I figured I'd
- 16 say hello here.
- 17 MR. ACKEN: Thank you.
- 18 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
- 19 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. Do we have some
- 20 exhibits for the prefiling conference?
- 21 MR. ACKEN: Yes. I provided a draft notice
- 22 of hearing and we can mark that as PFC Number 1.
- 23 very similar to the standard draft notice of hearing that
- 24 you -- we would do for committee hearing, just with a
- handful of modifications to address the fact that -- you 25

- 1 know, that we're going to do this in front of you as the
- 2 presiding officer. So I tried to add language to that
- 3 effect to make it clear that, again, this is going to be a
- 4 hearing before a hearing officer. At Mr. Hazle's catch I
- 5 added something at the end that said -- noted that this
- 6 will go to the full committee, you know, at a subsequent
- 7 open meeting that we would provide notice of on our
- 8 project website.
- 9 The -- I have proposed to eliminate the
- 10 entire discussion of a tour because I don't think you
- 11 envision a tour as a hearing officer. So that's been
- 12 removed.
- 13 And then the other -- I mean, the -- I guess
- 14 the other key components that I wanted to touch on with
- 15 you is really the timing. When do you want to start this
- 16 hearing? When did you want to take public comment? What
- 17 does that public comment look like? You know, are we
- 18 going to have the ability to have the public in the
- 19 building? Is it all going to be virtual? So I just want
- 20 to tee up those questions for you.
- 21 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. So we're looking
- 22 to do the hearing at the Commission in the upstairs
- 23 conference room.
- MR. ACKEN: Oh, great. So we have that now.
- 25 CHMN STAFFORD: Yes. I heard back -- I got

- 1 confirmation this morning.
- MR. ACKEN: Terrific. So in the small -- in
- 3 like the commissioner's conference room?
- 4 CHMN STAFFORD: Yes, on the second floor
- 5 where they have the staff meetings a lot of times.
- 6 MR. ACKEN: Okay.
- 7 CHMN STAFFORD: So that will be there.
- Yeah, I'm going to -- I'm going to tweak the
- 9 notice of hearing. I worked something up to -- for this
- 10 scenario since this will be the first case before the
- 11 hearing officer.
- 12 So I think we can start at 9:00 and then go
- 13 until you finish and then take public comment from 5:30 to
- 14 6:00. But we're not going to do a tour. There will be no
- 15 tour.
- 16 MS. BORN: You don't want to -- you don't
- 17 want to drive 15 miles across the desert in the middle of
- 18 the summer?
- 19 CHMN STAFFORD: No, I think not.
- 20 MR. ACKEN: And drive three, four hours to
- 21 get there and drive three, four hours to get back.
- 22 CHMN STAFFORD: Yeah. Yeah.
- MR. HAZLE: Well, SWCA has prepared a
- 24 virtual tour similar to what you are accustomed to seeing
- 25 at a regular hearing. So we will have that for your

- 1 benefit.
- CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. All right. So Jill,
- 3 do you have the exhibits that they sent out?
- 4 THE COURT REPORTER: Yes, I do.
- 5 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Well, let's admit
- 6 those.
- 7 MR. ACKEN: The others, just -- just for the
- 8 record, Mr. Chairman, is a map which is the project
- 9 corridor. You know, this is an approximately 15-mile
- 10 transmission line from the Winchester energy facilities in
- 11 the east near Win -- excuse me, Willcox, interconnecting
- 12 with the Winchester substation and switchyard to the west
- 13 there. So, again, about 15 miles. Primarily the corridor
- 14 is a thousand feet. At both ends it widens to provide for
- 15 some flexibility as we enter into Winchester and also
- 16 where the project substation will go.
- 17 That map includes our proposed sign
- 18 locations. And if you look at that map you will see we
- 19 only have two and they are in the western area. But
- 20 that's where -- that's the only public access. That's
- 21 where we have roads that cross the transmission line.
- 22 This is remote. And so that is our proposal for the
- 23 signs.
- 24 And then the third exhibit is the proposed
- 25 sign language itself. So, again, if -- You know, given

- 1 this is new, if you want us to modify the sign language
- 2 just let us know and we will do so accordingly.
- 3 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Yeah, once -- How
- 4 soon do you need the sign put up?
- 5 MR. ACKEN: Well, you know, that's not a
- 6 statutory or regulatory requirement. I think usually
- 7 what -- the procedural order likes to have everything
- 8 up -- is it 20 days before the hearing? You know, so we
- 9 do like to try and get it up relatively quickly. And they
- 10 need a bit of a heads-up for the sign company. But
- 11 obviously we want to get it right, and so I think that's
- 12 more important than a timing standpoint here.
- 13 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. So when I --
- 14 when we get the -- finalize the notice of hearing that
- 15 will be sufficient time for you to get the signs up?
- MR. ACKEN: Absolutely.
- 17 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. And what are the
- 18 affected jurisdictions?
- 19 MR. ACKEN: State land in Cochise County.
- 20 CHMN STAFFORD: You will get the certified
- 21 mail out to them. And which newspaper will the
- 22 publication be in?
- MR. ACKEN: So we are going to publish in --
- 24 it's the Harold Review. It's the newspaper of record for
- 25 Cochise. We are actually going to publish three dates

- 1 because only one of those dates does it actually publish
- 2 in Willcox proper. So we are going to publish on the 7th
- 3 and 9th and the 12th. That's going to be -- So I did want
- 4 to raise this with you. It's going to be a little tight
- 5 with -- You know, we're aiming to file Friday. That's the
- 6 plan. But we would need that notice of hearing docketed
- 7 by the -- early on the 5th. So I don't know what your
- 8 holiday schedule is, but in order to make that publication
- 9 time frame with that local newspaper that's what we will
- 10 need.
- 11 CHMN STAFFORD: So you need the notice of
- 12 hearing by July 5th?
- MR. ACKEN: Correct. Early on --
- 14 10:00 o'clock.
- 15 MR. HAZLE: 10:00 a.m. to meet the
- 16 newspaper's copy deadline.
- 17 CHMN STAFFORD: Just check here. That
- 18 should not be a problem.
- 19 And your plan is to file this Friday, the
- 20 30th?
- MR. ACKEN: Correct. Friday afternoon.
- 22 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. Okay. What's
- 23 the -- Tod, what's the date we're putting for the
- 24 prehearing conference then?
- MR. BREWER: We don't have that scheduled

- 1 yet, Mr. Chairman. That was something we needed to review
- 2 today.
- 3 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay.
- 4 MR. BREWER: Depending on when CEC 222 is
- 5 finished we could schedule for August the 11th.
- 6 CHMN STAFFORD: Yeah, I expect it will be
- 7 done by the 11th.
- 8 MR. BREWER: And we can do that at
- 9 2:00 o'clock, Mr. Chairman.
- 10 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. How does that sound,
- 11 Bert? August 11th, 2:00 p.m.
- 12 MR. ACKEN: That works for me. Thank you.
- 13 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Now, you've had --
- 14 have you had any interested members of the public or
- 15 potential intervenors?
- 16 MR. ACKEN: No. The short answer is no.
- 17 The applicant's team even -- They sent out mailers to
- 18 nearby landowners, lazing -- lazing -- grazing lessees, if
- 19 I can speak today, informing them of the project, inviting
- 20 them to an open house. That open house was held I believe
- 21 on the 19th. There were no attendees. And that's pretty
- 22 consistent with the public interest of this project.
- 23 Again, it's remote; it's on primarily state land that is
- 24 held on just a handful of grazing lessees. And the
- 25 project obviously won't interfere with those grazing

- 1 rights, so -- We have not had any feedback from the public
- 2 of note or at all and I'm not anticipating any at this
- 3 time.
- 4 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay.
- 5 MS. BORN: And Mr. Chairman, I'll add when
- 6 we permitted our solar portion of this project some of the
- 7 people in the vicinity -- I should say, many of them have
- 8 been notified through that process two times, because
- 9 we're also going through an amendment, and we have had no
- 10 comments in that regard either.
- 11 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. All right. So
- 12 there's no litigation or disputes.
- 13 And you will send me the hard copy of the
- 14 application when you file?
- MR. ACKEN: Correct.
- 16 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. All right. I'll get
- 17 the procedural order out as soon as I -- once I get that.
- 18 You know to provide the draft CEC by the
- 19 prehearing conference referencing the previous CEC?
- MR. ACKEN: Will do.
- 21 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. So you said -- Now,
- 22 what was the permitting you had to go through? You had
- 23 to -- Do you need a permit from the county, like a special
- 24 use permit or is it accepted use for this section and the
- 25 rest of it's on state land?

- 1 MS. BORN: It's a special use permit for the
- 2 solar facility.
- 3 CHMN STAFFORD: But not for the transmission
- 4 line? It's allowed --
- 5 MS. BORN: Not for the transmission, nope.
- 6 (Indecipherable due to simultaneous
- 7 crosstalk.)
- 8 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm sorry, what did you
- 9 say? Not for the transmission, it's allowed?
- 10 MS. BORN: Allowed by rate in Cochise
- 11 County.
- 12 CHMN STAFFORD: And then on state land you
- 13 have the leases in place then; right?
- MS. BORN: Right-of-ways, yes.
- 15 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay.
- 16 MS. BORN: We're working on that with the
- 17 state land department.
- 18 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Now, for technology
- 19 for the hearing that -- everything should be ready to go
- 20 in the Commission conference room. I'll need to talk to
- 21 Mike here next week and make sure they are all set up for
- 22 everything. If there's any issues -- which I don't
- 23 anticipate there should be -- I'll have Tod let you know.
- 24 But my -- my plan is -- I think that room is pretty much
- 25 already set up to have call-in, broadcasts, record

- 1 everything.
- We will have the court reporter there for
- 3 the hearing.
- 4 MR. ACKEN: Mr. Chairman, does that room
- 5 have video?
- 6 CHMN STAFFORD: I believe there's a screen
- 7 in there. It won't be -- it won't be two screens, it
- 8 might just be -- I think it's just one screen. But I will
- 9 double-check.
- 10 MR. ACKEN: But as far as like, you know,
- 11 external participants, I would -- It's been a while since
- 12 I listened to a staff meeting, but I thought that was
- 13 audio only when they are upstairs, for the public.
- 14 CHMN STAFFORD: Yeah, I'll talk -- I'll
- 15 confirm with Mike. But I think -- I think they have the
- 16 ability to do it, they just -- for staffing, they
- 17 typically don't take any comment. Typically even the
- 18 (indecipherable) don't speak in those, but I don't --
- 19 THE COURT REPORTER: The who doesn't speak
- 20 in those? I'm sorry.
- 21 CHMN STAFFORD: Advisors. Commissioners,
- 22 advisors typically don't even speak at the staff meetings.
- 23 What was the -- What's the size of this
- 24 line?
- MR. ACKEN: It's about 15 miles depending on

- 1 the interconnection. And I should -- You know, most of
- 2 the -- the vast majority of that the line is on state
- 3 land. That eastern interconnection is going to be on land
- 4 controlled by the applicant or where it interconnects with
- 5 the project substation, that -- but there's private land
- 6 options there and so, you know, there may be a small
- 7 portion of private land.
- 8 CHMN STAFFORD: What kV is the line?
- 9 MR. ACKEN: I'm sorry?
- 10 CHMN STAFFORD: What kV is the line?
- 11 MR. ACKEN: 345.
- 12 CHMN STAFFORD: 345.
- 13 MR. ACKEN: One other thing while we talking
- 14 about the details of the project before I forget, we are
- 15 not going to seek approval for the project substation.
- 16 And that's a little different than what I've done in some
- 17 of mine in the past. I know some others don't seek
- 18 authority for the -- for the substation. I think that's
- 19 where the Commission is today. So I -- You know, we're
- 20 going to have a footnote in the application that says
- 21 we're not, but if the Commission disagrees to approve it,
- 22 I'm going to propose for your consideration and the
- 23 Committees' consideration even a finding of fact and
- 24 conclusion of law that it doesn't require it, and then you
- 25 guys can talk about it. And if you guys say we need it,

- 1 you know, we'll ask for it. But it -- I just would like
- 2 that to be clear.
- 3 CHMN STAFFORD: Right. Because the statute
- 4 says switchyards but not substations.
- 5 MR. ACKEN: Exactly.
- 6 CHMN STAFFORD: So -- All right. And then
- 7 what was the filing fee for this?
- 8 MR. ACKEN: Filing fee?
- 9 CHMN STAFFORD: Yeah. Was it a thousand
- 10 dollars?
- MR. ACKEN: A thousand.
- 12 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Now, you know, the
- 13 Commission is obligated by the statute to pay the cost of
- 14 reporting and transcribing any hearings, as well as the
- 15 actual necessary expenses incurred by the committee
- 16 members in connection with their participation in the
- 17 meeting from the filing fee. And the costs and fees
- 18 exceeding the amount of the applicant's fee may, with the
- 19 applicant's consent, be incurred by the Committee and
- 20 charged to the applicant.
- 21 Does the applicant consent to pay the
- 22 Commission those costs in excess of the filing fee?
- MR. ACKEN: Yes.
- 24 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. Now, so the
- 25 court reporter is going to post the hearing -- the

- 1 transcripts to the applicant's website. And the
- 2 transcripts will be available three days after the
- 3 hearing; correct?
- 4 MR. ACKEN: That's correct.
- 5 CHMN STAFFORD: All right. Now, so since
- 6 this is going to be a hearing before the hearing officer,
- 7 not the full committee, we are going to need briefs from
- 8 the applicant at the conclusion of the hearing for the
- 9 members before the members will meet at a subsequent
- 10 meeting to vote.
- 11 MR. ACKEN: Understood.
- Do you have a sense yet of how and when that
- 13 subsequent committee meeting will be done? Is that going
- 14 to be virtual or can we do it on the back end of another
- 15 hearing? You know, I've got a couple in early
- 16 September where the committee, in theory, will be together
- 17 already. What are your thoughts?
- 18 CHMN STAFFORD: Well, how long -- how long
- 19 do you think it will take you to do the brief? Two weeks?
- 20 Three weeks?
- MR. ACKEN: Well, we'll need the transcript,
- 22 so that's three days. But, you know, I can make a
- 23 commitment to turn it quickly. This is important for
- 24 the -- for this applicant. That's why we're asking -- We
- 25 thank you greatly for going through this process. So I

- 1 won't be the holdup. So I can turn it in a couple weeks.
- CHMN STAFFORD: All right. All right. Now,
- 3 you have -- You know, Tod, we have two -- we have a couple
- 4 hearings in September; correct?
- 5 MR. BREWER: That's correct, Mr. Chairman.
- 6 CHMN STAFFORD: And they are -- those are in
- 7 Yavapai -- they are up in Flagstaff?
- 8 MR. BREWER: I believe so, yes.
- 9 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. And when do those
- 10 hearings wrap up?
- 11 MR. BREWER: We have them scheduled from
- 12 September 5th and 6th for the first project and then the
- 13 7th and the 8th for the second project.
- 14 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Well, we could -- No,
- 15 I believe that's for -- Stellar Renewable's the one from
- 16 the 7th and the 8th. Mr. Acken, is that -- is that your
- 17 case as well?
- 18 MR. ACKEN: It is. Both of those are.
- 19 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay. Now, we could set the
- 20 committee meeting to commence that afternoon of the 8th.
- 21 We could hold it there. Because you'd have the facilities
- 22 for the Stellar Renewable gen-tie still set up at the
- 23 location; correct?
- MR. ACKEN: That's correct. I'm going to
- 25 turn to Dean to confirm, but I believe so.

- 1 MR. HAZLE: Yes.
- 2 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay.
- MR. ACKEN: Would you want the applicant's
- 4 team to be there in person? Obviously myself and
- 5 Mr. Hazle will be in person, but, you know, do you -- is
- 6 it important, do you think, to have a representative of
- 7 the applicant there in person as well or could they
- 8 participate virtually? That's my only -- My only
- 9 reticence of doing it concurrently with others is, you
- 10 know, travel to Flagstaff is not so easy as it used to be
- 11 because they have reduced flights.
- 12 CHMN STAFFORD: Well, we don't have to do it
- 13 then. We could do it that Monday or Tuesday -- the
- 14 following Monday or Tuesday. But then we do it -- the
- 15 location would be probably either -- and I assume for that
- 16 most of the members -- we would have -- the location for
- 17 that meeting would be either at the Commission or the AG's
- 18 office, and then we'd have -- most of the members I assume
- 19 would attend virtually.
- 20 MR. ACKEN: Maybe -- maybe I'll take that as
- 21 an action item for my team to see how -- Because I like
- 22 the idea of having the committee there in person, and I
- 23 really don't like the idea of asking the committee to meet
- 24 again. So, you know, maybe I'll take this offline and let
- 25 Tod know about our availability to have a rep there in

- 1 person and have others available remote.
- 2 CHMN STAFFORD: Yeah. Because we have
- 3 flexibility on when to hold that, so -- I just -- Make
- 4 sure we have enough time. You need to get the briefs out
- 5 for the members to read them before they meet to vote.
- 6 MR. ACKEN: Does the committee have other
- 7 hearings in September that are in Maricopa?
- MR. BREWER: We do not.
- 9 CHMN STAFFORD: We have other hearings from
- 10 the 18th through the 22nd potentially, but that's in
- 11 Yavapai County. And that's the other one for September.
- MR. ACKEN: Okay.
- 13 CHMN STAFFORD: So my thought is we could
- 14 pretty much do the committee meeting virtually anytime
- 15 during the week of the 11th, except for Monday afternoon
- 16 from 3:00 to 4:00 when I have a --
- 17 MR. ACKEN: That certainly will work for our
- 18 team as well, the virtual, you know, as long as that works
- 19 for the committee. We do want to be, you know, respectful
- 20 of your time and their time.
- 21 MS. BORN: I second that. We will make
- 22 whatever works --
- 23 CHMN STAFFORD: Okay.
- MS. BORN: -- for you all, Mr. Chairman.
- 25 CHMN STAFFORD: So we don't have to set that

- 1 today, but thank you for your cooperation and flexibility.
- 2 All right. Well, Tod, do we have anything
- 3 else?
- 4 MR. BREWER: I don't believe so,
- 5 Mr. Chairman. Thank you.
- 6 CHMN STAFFORD: Anything further from the
- 7 applicant, Mr. Acken?
- 8 MR. ACKEN: So just to confirm, on AV, we're
- 9 going to -- if we are doing it at the Commission we don't
- 10 need external AV. We can rely on the Commission's
- 11 internal expertise; correct?
- 12 CHMN STAFFORD: Yes. That is my
- 13 understanding. And I will confirm that this week or next
- 14 and I'll have -- if there's a -- That's my understanding,
- 15 but if that changes I will have Tod let you know --
- MR. ACKEN: Okay.
- 17 CHMN STAFFORD: -- and we can make other
- 18 arrangements. But my understanding is that that room is






